

Fall 2019 Report



The Gallatin Invasive Species Alliance teamed up with other local organizations to build a demonstration garden at Crail Ranch using native plants that are wildlife friendly, water wise, and preserving of the historic landscape.

Once established, native plants are easy to maintain because they are adapted to Montana's temperatures, rainfall patterns, and soil conditions.

The demonstration garden will educate residents, students, and visitors about sustainable gardening, showcase water savings over time, and enhance the Ranch's natural heritage.



Building the Gardens

fall 2018

Donated topsoil from an adjacent construction project was moved and stored onsite, and garden #1 was built.



spring 2018

A cool, wet spring delayed the start of construction. Site excavation, garden beds and gravel paths were completed on July 9.



Planting and Irrigation

planting

On July 9 & 11, 20 volunteers planted 692 native plants (25 different species) putting in a combined 149 hours!



irrigation

Perimeter rocks were placed around each garden, and irrigation was installed to achieve water conservation goals.



Mulching & Weeding

mulching

13 volunteers applied shredded cedar mulch over 2 days to conserve water & protect plants, putting in 59 hours!





Gardens were routinely inspected for weeds during the build, often recieving help from trusted companions.
